BALTIMORE, MD – August 22, 2017 – Procure Ambulance of Maryland, Inc., dba Procure Integrated Health and Transport, a woman-owned, full-service commercial ambulance and wheelchair van transportation company, is pleased to announce that its certification as a Minority Business Enterprise (MBE) in the areas of both Special Needs Transportation and Ambulance Services has been renewed for the 6th time. The recognition comes from the Maryland Department of Transportation (MDOT). Procure is also certified as an MBE for the City of Baltimore and Prince George’s County.

“Procure’s continued status as an MBE has made us a great partner for forward thinking companies seeking to do business with minorities and woman-owned companies,” states Debbie Ailiff, President and CEO of the company. “I look forward to seeing more female business owners enjoy the benefits of state and local MBE certification.”

Having MBE certification offers a number of benefits, including greater exposure to contracting opportunities and inclusion in MDOT’s online directory of certified firms. A business must be recognized as a MBE in order to be counted toward the minority participation goal on state-funded contracts issued by the State of Maryland, contracts funded by counties and cities within Maryland that accept MDOT’s certification for their minority participation programs, and federally-funded contracts issued by the U. S. Department of Transportation. Some local contracts also require the MBE to be certified on the local level.

In order to receive certification, interested organizations must meet eligibility standards, submit a comprehensive application, undergo an on-site investigation and pass an evaluation that includes a formal interview by the Minority Business Enterprise Advisory Committee (MBEAC). This process also involves a detailed review of the company’s financial records, policies and procedures, and compliance with state and federal laws.

MBE certification requires annual renewal, including confirmation of continued compliance with the standards set by the MBEAC.
